

St. Isidore Parish Council Meeting February 8, 2024 — 6:30 p.m. — St. Celestine Parish Hall —UNAPPROVED —

Father led a prayer. Dave Schmitt called the meeting to order. Present: Dave (president), Clara Fromme (secretary), Kenny Beckman, Mike Betz (2nd Chair), Chris Bieker, Ben Gessner, Bill Hochgesang, Christine Sander, Sherry Schnell, Kelly Tretter. Excused: Kirby Gordon, Lori Merkley. Staff: Fr. John Pfister, Brooke Atkins, Kristy Buechler, Angie Mundy, Clarence Reckelhoff, Glenda Reckelhoff, Rev. Mike Seibert. Excused: Kirby Gordon, Lori Merkley, Joe DeKemper, and Craig Gehlhausen. January 2024 minutes were approved.

Father gave the financial summary, first noting that average weekend Mass attendance for January 2024 (623) is up 2.38% over January 2023 (609). Attendance clearly needs approving. It will be reported monthly and brought to Parish Council because it is clearly related to the financial picture. Current assets are \$629,641 and obligations are \$278,474, leaving unencumbered assets \$351,666.

Income from 7/1/23 to 1/31/24 is up 11.05% over 7/1/22 to 1/31/23. Expenses for the same period are up 3.66%. Income (loss) is up nearly 200% over the same time last year. Expenses for the second Director of Faith Formation position and the estimated CMA shortage total \$72,500. The Hopf bid (without further asbestos remediation or fill dirt) for the school demolition project is \$123,900. Once this is paid from the Capital Improvements fund, the remaining balance will be \$23,100, and this may need replenishment from unencumbered funds. Unknowns for the balance of the fiscal year include: collection amounts and expenses for foundation subsidence at St. Peter Celestine Church.

New Business — Brooke (Reuber) Atkins was hired from a pool of five applicants, and welcomed with applause as the Director of Faith Formation. The website had over 600 hits yesterday, the highest number of hits ever, as Brooke made her first post. Brooke is married to Aaron Atkins, and they have four children. Brooke has experience in school and teaching in our religious education program. Brooke noted her children are involved in youth activities, she is very excited to be working with them and the entire Parish.

Clara Fromme spoke about the May 1st Parish bus trip. The day will begin with departure from St. Raphael church at 8 AM. The first stop will be downtown Madison, Indiana, and then on to Oldenburg for lunch at the Brau Haus and guided tours of the Oldenburg Monastery. The outing will end with a trip back to Madison, this time to the Clifty Falls Inn for a bite to eat if desired, and relaxation to view the Ohio River from the hilltop before returning to Dubois. The cost is \$90. The Parish is invited first and if there are seats remaining, the churches nearby. The last trip, outside churches were not necessary.

Glenda reported Deacon Caleb Scherzinger will be ordained a priest on Saturday, June 22, at 11 a.m., Dubois County time, at St. Benedict's Cathedral in Evansville. He will celebrate his First Mass, the Mass of Thanksgiving on Sunday, June 23, at 3 PM at St. Celestine Church. A dinner will be held afterwards at the Celestine Community Club. Plans are being made according to Caleb's wishes. Limited family members and priests will be given free tickets; others will pay for their meals. Reservations will be taken. Each of the parishes where Caleb has served will be given a number of tickets to sell if they wish. Desserts will be requested from parishioners. Caleb's family has donated the cost of regilding Father Schnellenberger's chalice, and the parish will commission a box for it. Caleb has secured a paton. The Knights of Columbus will have a gift for him, and several ideas are being discussed for a gift from St. Isidore as his home parish.

Father has spoken with students in religious education classes, encouraging them to talk to their parents about becoming altar servers. Students may let their teachers know of their interest: which church and which Mass time they attend. Senior servers will be paired with the new servers as they come on to train them.

Old Business —Clarence reported Jeremy Hopf Construction has the fence up around the Celestine School. Demolition will start on Monday, February 12, with the permit having been granted. The gas, power, and sprinklers have all been disconnected. Water and sewer hook-ups will be taken care of by Jeremy. REC will keep the dusk-to-dawn lights shining. Two belong to the town and three belong to the parish. A company from Louisville will crush the bricks and concrete, and the ground-up stone will fill the basement hole. Along with this, fill dirt is needed and is being solicited. Grass will be planted on the leveled area; nothing is planned for the site in the foreseeable future. The garage and parking lot will remain in place. One issue is that there may be asbestos under the rubber roof that was installed over the original roof. The state inspector is in charge of determining if testing and removal are necessary.

Clarence continued, a concern has been noted in a deepening crack in the northeast wall of St. Celestine Church. Three companies have looked at it, all offering different opinions. The conclusion is that Universal Designs will draw up a plan to best address the situation, as the wall seems to have "dropped" an inch or two. Caulking on the outside has split open. A minor crack had been noticed years ago, but the past dry summer could have been a contributory cause for the precast wall to have now sunk a few inches.

Faith Formation - Glenda reported a shortage of catechists right now. Glenda will be employed until June 27. Father foresees 90 days of training for Brooke. On May 1, Brooke will assume more authority. Over the years, the Director of Faith Formation has assumed administrative duties, with a long list not proper for the job. Brooke states she is confident she can do these additional duties, but the addition of another part time worker may be needed. Father said he has every confidence that Brooke will be ready on May 1 for the transfer of duties. He hopes by June 1, "Glenda can revel in the success of her career," and prepare for her new role with the church outside full-time staff before retiring June 27. Father appointed Kristy to head up a public recognition celebration for Glenda at a date to be determined.

Youth Ministry - Craig sent his report to be given by Brooke citing a great turnout for both the raffle tickets and the night of fellowship. An estimated \$10,000 was raised for religious education. A detailed accounting will be given about how the night fared with gaming and non-gaming income. Craig noted success in the junior high ministry and wishes to focus this as a community building ministry to enable moving on to high school as a more cohesive group. High school students are moving into the 4th and final section of "Equipped for Life." Students are exploring why Jesus and having a personal relationship with him matters. Spots are open for the trip to Catholic Heart Workcamp in Knoxville from June 23 - 28. Students entering 8th grade through high school and adults are eligible. Signups for Source and Summit are ongoing.

Deacon's Report - Deacon Mike noted that following the success of the Advent brunch sessions at St. Raphael's, and there will be Lenten sessions. Six individuals have been invited to present witness talks - to evoke "transformation, not just information." The presenter teams are from the Couples-to- Couples program. Young couples are eager about the program, with 22 couple having attended the January 6 event with speaker Father Simon. Eighteen men are doing Exodus 90, 12 women are doing Magnify 20, and the Cursillo group consists of 15 men, with several discerning the diac-

Priest Report — Father noted that last weekend was incredible for the church and for him. Ten young men worked on the first-floor rectory bathroom. He said the way they cooperated with work and fun which a joy to watch. Clarence will run the electricity for the new bathroom on Friday, and the only labor to be paid for is the plumbing. Kenny Schnell was thanked for their efforts in raising \$8,650 of the \$10,000 cost for the project, and he and Father are looking to get donations for the remaining 1,350; Martha Goepfrich was thanked for organizing a second collection for the Gehlhausen family. Father thanked the committee for doing the design and work and Kristy for proposing the use of the remaining tile and paint from the Church renovation. Father attended Doris Meyer's 90th birthday party, and she was a light and a joy. Saturday night Mass had a large attendance and Drew Schroering spoke for the Boy Scouts. Throats were blessed. The dinner and raffle event was fun as he witnessed a strong sense of community represented by both churches. On Sunday the Scouts served at the altar, read, and brought up the gifts. Religious awards were presented to the Scouts mothers who pinned them to each Scout. He said, "It's a joy to be here."

Kenny Beckman offered congratulations for Craig Gehlhausen's family's addition of baby Rebecca and for Kirby Gordon's family's addition of baby Dane. Father closed with a prayer that included families suffering sickness at Saint Isidore and a prayer for unity and oneness of the Parish.
