

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CLASSES


Wednesday evening class time is from 7:00pm till 8:00pm. Parents please pick students up by 8:10.

Hello,

As school has begun to start in recent weeks, I have started reading the book *The Story* of a Soul by St. Therese of Lisieux. As Catholics, I think reading books about saints is important. I think the stories of saints give us an idea of how to live out holiness in our own lives. Saints can show us how to find the extraordinary ways God works in our ordinary lives. When we read about saints, we should read them in such a way that we observe their holiness to help grow our own holiness. In learning about Saints, we need to reflect on how we can improve our own lives. We can improve our lives based on the lives of the saints we learn about. I hope to accomplish this by reading *The Story of a Soul*.



The Story of a Soul is an autobiographical account of St. Therese's life in 1880s France. In the second half of the book, she talks about her time living in a cloistered monastery in France. One major takeaway from this story is what St. Therese calls the "little way." St. Therese felt that it was impossible to be heroic in her simple life in a cloistered monastery. So, she found that through little acts, she would seek out the path to heaven. She would perform little acts of virtue and sacrifice to seek out heaven. These acts were not grand sacrifices of martyrdom or converting entire nations with her preaching. They were little acts of charity to her fellow sisters. They were small sacrifices to become a saint. She showed that every person is called to holiness. Every person is called to be a saint, and we can do it in our own little way. In which we perform little acts of charity and sacrifices. These little acts, like little grains of sand, build on each other, and eventually, will create a mountain of charity and sacrifice. A mountain of holiness. These consistent little acts lead to holiness and sainthood.



As this book has challenged me, I challenge everyone to find their own little way. In your little acts of charity and sacrifices, you can grow in holiness and slowly change the world starting in our own little corner of southern Indiana. Through these little ways, we can make actual changes around us.

Wisdom Day


