

Dear Saint Isidore,

The St. Raphael Church cleaning is complete. I wanted to share a few notes with you regarding what to expect.

- 1. The entire church has been disinfected, in most cases 2-3 treatments worth. Since we do not use any high pressure, there are some areas where old lichen growth will take some time to disintegrate and fall away with natural rain and sun. It's all dead, just will take some time to continue to brighten up. We don't force more off than what cleans away naturally. This pertains primarily to the top stone caps of the walls, not so much the actual sandstone itself. This is expected and typical of cleaning limestone/sandstone. There are a few areas where the stone is much darker from water runoff over time, such as on the side pillars near the front on the south side of the building. This has all been cleaned multiple times and is just how the surface of the stone is.
- 2. On the north side, there are a few "shadows" near the top where the heaviest algae streaking was. This is from the algae and water erosion on the surface of the stone over the years physically wearing away the stone, making it appear darker. We've completely disinfected and treated this, just wanted you to know in the event you see some faint darker spots here or there.
- 3. We refrained from spraying too much on the bottom row of blocks on the north side because they appeared to be the most brittle of any of the stones on the church that we noted during our pre-work inspection. So there may be some very minor algae or grass stains still there but we thought it better to do no harm than try to forceclean that off.
- 4..10% of our profits go to help local children in need and this job will help us purchase winter coats for kids who do not have any this year.

What is Catechetical Sunday?

Parents and guardians, grandparents are also catechists; they are the first and primary teachers of the faith for their children.

On Catechetical Sunday, we come together as both a parish and Church community to acknowledge the dedication of those who serve as catechists in our parish family. We also honor parents, grandparents, and guardians on this day, since they are the true first catechists, sharing the Catholic faith with their families.

It is hard to really express the true gratitude and appreciation of working in a parish that the faith of your children and grandchildren is very important to you. If the catechists that assist you in teaching the faith to your children have the support at home, it makes their job much easier and beneficial.
